




COMMUNITY GRA **NEWSLETTER**

NEWS FROM LANDAU



Callum was referred to ANTA Education by his Reed work coach to complete his Forklift License Training Course (FLT). When talking with Callum, it was clear that this was something he was very excited about, with a long-term goal to be a certified counterbalance driver. Callum did not have previous experience and had never managed to get a FLT licence before due to finances and lack of the IT equipment needed to complete the eLearning element of the course. Another barrier Callum faced was not being able to drive, which had held him back in terms of travelling to previous potential training courses.

Completing the course has been a personal goal for Callum and thanks to the full support of Dulson Training Ltd, Callum has been able to travel to the FLT course and use the IT equipment at ANTAs office to complete and pass both the theory side of the course and the practical element of the FLT counterbalance course – and with a 90% pass rate! Callum is now able to add the FLT license to his CV and is feeling much more confident about securing employment. He is also continuing to benefit from having support with interview preparation and the sourcing of job opportunities.

We are really proud that Callum has been able to overcome the barriers that previously prevented him moving forward, using the resources provided.

As the Community Grants project draws to a close, our team will continue to keep in touch to discuss the progress of your delivery, monitor your performance and ensure your targets are on track. 
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Our Target Spend = £1,500,000
