Our Access group enjoyed an outing to the local synagogue in Newcastle, where Martin Morris from the Jewish community kindly spoke to the learners, sharing lots of interesting facts. As usual, our learners did us proud with the polite way in which they conducted themselves and the respect that they showed.



Our Travel Training group have also been active with a trip to Tunstall. They planned their own bus journey perfectly and were able to see the local sights and familiarise themselves with their surroundings.

Our Hair and Beauty learners have been practising threading yarn onto some heads they've designed themselves. Although the end result is very pretty, this is a really key activity as it improves and maintains hand and eye co-ordination skills, fine motor skills and sequential memory - all of which are essential when working with a client's hair.

Congratulations to Rhys & Andrew-Lee

We love following our learners on their journeys to success and sharing their news with others. We hope you enjoy reading about Rhys and Andrew-Lee below.

Rhys started at Landau in September 2018 as part of the very first Newstead Study Programme cohort. Since joining, he has achieved an incredible amount including qualifications in maths, English, PSD, Employability and a vocational qualification in Sport and Leisure.

Rhys has also worked with staff to meet a personal goal of travelling independently on public transport, which he now does regularly. He has developed his employability skills from both mock and real interviews, as well as work experience placements. In January 2022, he gained a volunteer placement at Mind in Longton, where he helps out one day a week. He is passionate about his work here and is an asset to the team!

Andrew-Lee joined our Study Programme in September 2021. He wanted to be challenged academically and in his first year achieved English and maths Entry Level 2, plus an ASDAN Certificate in Personal and Social Development (PSD).

Andrew-Lee also wanted to improve his employability skills and has now achieved his Entry Level 3 Speaking, Listening & Communication, alongside the reading element of his English qualification. We are confident he will achieve his full Functional Skills soon. He also accesses elements of our social care provision, which has developed his social skills and has helped him when working in our café.

Over the next 12 months, Andrew-Lee hopes to complete a vocational qualification in catering and is optimistic he will enter this industry in the future. We are very excited for him.



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
