A visit to The Little Green Pantry

As part of the Personal Social Development unit, we've been discussing environmental issues which included a talk by the Climate Action Hub Telford. Our learners also enjoyed a visit to The Little Green Pantry in Wellington, which is a zero-waste shop. The owner shared information on why she had set the shop up, how it works and what the benefits of it are. This was a great opportunity for our learners to understand a different kind of local initiative, with the chance also to explore what was on offer and how they could purchase items if they wanted to.

"In July of 2019, I started with anxiety and this affected me going into Year 9 the following September. I got through the first week before I told someone about it; they put me on half-days as well as letting me work in a quieter room. I was on half-days until Covid-19 hit and the school closed due to lockdown. I actually enjoyed lockdown as I didn't have to go to school.

"The following September, I started home school which helped as I no longer had to go in to school. However, I still did not like it that much and by April 2021, I had quit and was not in any kind of education. My anxiety was still very high during this time, however I then found out about Landau.

"I was anxious about the taster days but after the first one it got easier. Come September, I was still anxious about starting but each day became easier and I made a really good friend. As I had not taken my GCSEs, my English and maths skills had slipped but now I have moved on a whole level and have attended Landau every day, on time, apart from the week I had Covid!"
